Usage in the New Testament

The sense of  $\pi \tilde{\alpha} \varsigma$  depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 ἦσανplugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip\_bigεἰμί

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

lt an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. προσκαρτεροῦντες ὁμοθυμαδὸν τῆplugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip\_bigὁ

ESV	All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.
NIV	They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.
NLT	They all met together and were constantly united in prayer, along with Mary the mother of Jesus, several other women, and the brothers of Jesus.
KJV	These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren.
