	ὅτι κατηριθμημένος ἦν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. ἡμῖν καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Greek Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἔλαχεν τὸν greek The definite article κληρον τῆς greek The definite article διακονίας ταύτης. greek Meaning: * These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it Demonstrative pronoun. οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19
ESV	For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.”
NIV	he was one of our number and shared in this ministry.”
NLT	Judas was one of us and shared in the ministry with us.”
KJV	For he was numbered with us, and had obtained part of this ministry.

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
