IT is most frequently translated as “and” μὴ ἔστω greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ὁ greek The definite article κατοικῶν ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. αὐτῇ, greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive).
