It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. αὐτοῖςplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός</div> <div>greek</div> <div>Meaning</div> <div>* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same</div> <div>Personal pronoun (reflexive). | NLT | When he found him, he brought him back to Antioch. Both of them stayed there with the church for a full year, teaching large crowds of people. (It was at Antioch that the believers were first called Christians.)          |
| KJV | And when he had found him, he brought him unto Antioch. And it came to pass, that a whole year they assembled themselves with the church, and taught much people. And the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch. |

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
