	Demonstrative pronoun. οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 δὲplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigδέ

	δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ταῖςplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

	The definite article ἡμέραις κατήλθον ἀπὸ Ἱεροσολύμων προφῆται εἰς Ἀντιόχειαν·
ESV	Now in these days prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch.
NIV	During this time some prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch.
NLT	During this time some prophets traveled from Jerusalem to Antioch.
KJV	And in these days came prophets from Jerusalem unto Antioch.
