	ἀνεῖλεν δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. Ἰάκωβον τὸν greek The definite article ἀδελφὸν Ἰωάννου μαχαίρη.
ESV	He killed James the brother of John with the sword,
NIV	He had James, the brother of John, put to death with the sword.
NLT	He had the apostle James (John's brother) killed with a sword.
KJV	And he killed James the brother of John with the sword.
