It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. σύ, ἐγὼ σήμερον γεγέννηκά σε. this he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus, as also it is written in the second **ESV** Psalm, "' You are my Son, today I have begotten you.' he has fulfilled for us, their children, by raising up Jesus.
