Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 συνειδήσει ἀγαθῇ πεπολίτευμαι τῷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

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Masculine noun meaning:

* A god or goddess * God ἄχρι ταύτης plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὔτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο

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Meaning:

* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it

Demonstrative pronoun.

οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 τῆςplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ
