εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ὁμῖν ὅτι τοῖς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὔτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο

The definite article ἔθνεσιν ἀπεστάλη τοῦτο plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὔτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο

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Meaning:

* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it

Demonstrative pronoun.

οὔτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 τὸ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὔτος

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The definite article σωτήριον τοῦ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὔτος

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The definite article θεοῦ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigθεός

Masculine noun meaning:

* A god or goddess * God αὐτοῖς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

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Meaning

* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
