	Meaning
	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So
	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” προσευξάμενοι ἐπέθηκαν αὐτοῖς
	greek
	Meaning
	* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same
Greek	Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
	Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English)
	τὰς
	greek
	The definite article χεῖρας.
	ESV
	These they set before the apostles, and they prayed and laid their hands on them.
	NIV
	They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.
	NLT
	These seven were presented to the apostles, who prayed for them as they laid their hands on them.
	KJV
	Whom they set before the apostles: and when they had prayed, they laid their hands on them.

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
