	εἰς γὰρ χολὴν πικρίας καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Greek Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” σύνδεσμον ἀδικίας ὁρῶ σε ὄντα. greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g.
ESV	For I see that you are in the gall of bitterness and in the bond of iniquity.”
NIV	For I see that you are full of bitterness and captive to sin.”
NLT	for I can see that you are full of bitter jealousy and are held captive by sin.”
KJV	For I perceive that thou art in the gall of bitterness, and in the bond of iniquity.
