είμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. **τε ὑποστρέφων καὶ**plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί

The definite article **ἄρματος αὐτοῦ**plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

Meaning

* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
