	γνωστὸν δέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἐγένετο greek Meaning * To Become * To Come into being * Generate * To Happen * Brought to pass Verb. Different from εἶμι (which means “to be” - a state of existence); γίνομαι, instead, emphasizes coming to be - a transition or event. John 1:14 John 1:3 Matthew 6:10 καθ’ ὅλης τῆς Greek greek The definite article ἰόππης, καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐπίστευσαν πολλοὶ ἐπὶ τὸν greek The definite article κύριον.

NLT	The news spread through the whole town, and many believed in the Lord.
KJV	And it was known throughout all Joppa; and many believed in the Lord.

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
