	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἦν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. <i>ἡμέρας τρεῖς μὴ βλέπων, καὶ</i>

	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” οὐκ ἔφαγεν οὐδὲ greek Meaning * Not * Nor * Neither * Not even A combination of the words οὐ (meaning no) and δέ (meaning however or but). The word οὐδέ adds another negative element to a sentence that already has one. οὐδέ can join words, phrases, or whole clauses. It often functions like English Matthew 6:20John 7:5Romans 3:10 <i>ἔπλεν.</i>
ESV	And for three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.
NIV	For three days he was blind, and did not eat or drink anything.
NLT	He remained there blind for three days and did not eat or drink.
KJV	And he was three days without sight, and neither did eat nor drink.

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
