Hebrew	הָיָה hebrew
	The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
	This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.
	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 בְּנִקְדִּים מִתְקֹוֹעַ אֲשֶׁר חָזָה עַל יִשְׂרָאֵל בַּיּוֹם הַהוּא וּבַיּוֹם הַהוּא יִהְיֶה מֶלֶךְ יְהוָה וּבַיּוֹם הַהוּא יִרְבְּעִם בֶּן יוֹאֵשׁ מֶלֶךְ יִשְׂרָאֵל שְׁנָתִים לִפְנֵי הָרֶעִשׁ
ESV	The words of Amos, who was among the shepherds of Tekoa, which he saw concerning Israel in the days of Uzziah king of Judah and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash, king of Israel, two years before the earthquake.
NIV	The words of Amos, one of the shepherds of Tekoa-what he saw concerning Israel two years before the earthquake, when Uzziah was king of Judah and Jeroboam son of Jehoash was king of Israel.
NLT	This message was given to Amos, a shepherd from the town of Tekoa in Judah. He received this message in visions two years before the earthquake, when Uzziah was king of Judah and Jeroboam II, the son of Jehoash, was king of Israel.
