

Christianity

Christianity is the world's most widely practiced religion, encompassing a rich diversity of traditions and expressions. Despite denominational differences, Christians are united in their faith in Jesus Christ, the Son of God and the Saviour of the world. At its heart, Christianity is not merely a moral system or a cultural tradition, but a living relationship with the [Triune God](#), revealed supremely in the person and work of [Jesus](#) Christ.

The term Christianity is derived from the Greek word Christ ([Χριστός](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigΧριστός

Christ means “anointed one”

The equivalent Hebrew word is Messiah (מָשִׁיחַ)

The Essence of Christianity

Christianity is fundamentally the story of God's initiative to reconcile fallen humanity to Himself. [God](#) created the world and everything in it ([Genesis 1:1](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigGenesis 1:1

Humanity was created in God's image ([Genesis 1:27](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigGenesis 1:27

Jesus lived a sinless life, proclaimed the good news of the [Kingdom of God](#), and willingly laid down His life on the cross as a substitutionary sacrifice for sinners ([1 Peter 3:18](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big1 Peter 3:18)

Jesus calls all people to repent of their sin, trust in Him for salvation, and follow Him as Lord ([Mark 1:15](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigMark 1:15)

NIV That if you confess with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord,). Through faith in Jesus, believers are justified, that is, declared righteous before God, and not by works, but by grace alone ().

To be a Christian, then, is not merely to adhere to a moral code or belong to a religious institution, but to be born again by the Holy Spirit ([John 3:3](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigJohn 3:3

To be Christian is to know and walk with Jesus Christ as Savior, Lord, and Friend.

The Bible

The [Bible](#) is the divinely inspired and authoritative word of God, comprised of 66 books, 39 in the [Old Testament](#) and 27 in the [New Testament](#). Written by human authors under the guidance of the [Holy Spirit](#) (<autott>2_timothy_3:16|2 Timothy 3:16<autott> and <autott>2_peter_1:21|2 Peter 1:21<autott>), it is without error in its original manuscripts and is the authority in all matters of faith and life.

The Bible tells the grand story of [redemption](#): creation, fall, promise, fulfillment, and new creation. The Old Testament points forward to the coming of the Messiah through God's covenant relationship with Israel. The New Testament reveals Jesus Christ as the fulfillment of those promises and details the birth and growth of the early Church.

The Bible includes various genres including historical narrative, poetry, wisdom literature, prophecy, gospel, and epistle. It calls readers not only to knowledge but also to faith, obedience and worship. The Bible is the standard by which all doctrine and experience must be tested.

The Church

The Church is not primarily a building, but the community of all who have been redeemed through faith in Jesus Christ. It is described in Scripture as the body of Christ ([1 Corinthians 12:27](#)), the bride of Christ ([Ephesians 5:25–27](#)), and the temple of the Holy Spirit ([1 Peter 2:5](#)).

While Christians are united spiritually in one body, the visible church is expressed in a multitude of local congregations and denominations. These reflect historical, cultural, and theological differences. Among the largest traditions are Roman Catholicism, Eastern Orthodoxy, and Protestantism—including Reformed, Anglican, Baptist, Pentecostal, and non-denominational churches.

The church is called to gather for worship, preaching of the word, the celebration of the sacraments (or ordinances) of baptism and the Lord's Supper, and to be a light to the nations ([Matthew 28:18-20](#)).

The Christian Life

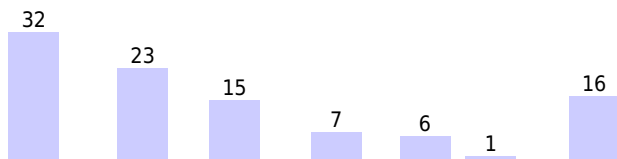
The Christian life is one of ongoing discipleship, growing in holiness, love, and obedience through the work of the Holy Spirit. Believers are called to love God with all their heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love their neighbours as themselves ([Matthew 22:37-39](#)).

Christians are also called to engage in mission, proclaiming the gospel to every nation ([Acts 1:8](#)).

This calling is not only the task of clergy or missionaries but the calling of every follower of Jesus. As salt and light ([Matthew 5:13-16](#)), Christians are to reflect God's character in every sphere of life, including work, family, politics, and the arts.

The World

As of the early 21st century, Christianity remains the largest religion globally, with over 2.3 billion adherents, comprising approximately 32% of the world's population. Christians are found on every continent, with rapid growth occurring in Africa, Latin America, and parts of Asia. By contrast, many traditionally Christian nations in Europe and North America are experiencing secularization. ¹⁾

Despite the global presence of Christianity, believers in many countries face significant opposition, ranging from social exclusion to legal restrictions and persecution.
