The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).

It is distinct from ὅτι ("that," introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning ἡμεῖς καταγγέλλομεν νοθετοῦντες πάντα plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big πᾶς

* All * Every * The whole

Adjective.

Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9 John 3:16 Romans 5:12 Matthew 28:19 Colossians 1:16 Romans 3:23 John 3:16 Colossians 1:17 ἄνθρωπον καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big καί

* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" διδάσκοντες πάντα plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big πᾶς

Preposition meaning "in". πάσῃ
 plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big πᾶς

greek

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 plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big ἐν

Preposition meaning "in". Χριστῷ

Christ means "anointed one"
