Hebrew	קָהוֹרִים כָּל צִפּוֹר טָהוֹרָה hebrew Meaning * Clean * Pure Adjective. The word קָהוֹר (from the root טָהַר) can be used to describe physical, ceremonial or moral purity, depending on the context. It is contrasted with the word טָמֵא which means unclean or impure. 	πᾶν greek Meaning * All * Every * The whole Adjective. Usage in the New Testament The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable. With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9 John 3:16 Romans 5:12 Matthew 28:19 Colossians 1:16 Romans 3:23 John 3:16 Colossians 1:17 ὅρνεον καθαρὸν φάγεσθε
