	The Hebrew אַת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.
	For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בָּרֵא אֱלֹהֵים (מֵאָה בֶּטֶף וְנְתָנוּ לַאֲבֵי הַנְּצֵרָה כֵּי הוֹצִיאֹ שַׁם רְּע עֵל בְּתוּלֵת יִשְׂרָאֵל וְלִוֹ תִהְיֵה plugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_big.

	The word הָיָה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
	This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.
	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לְשֶּׁלְחָהּ בְּל יְמֵינוּ
ESV	and they shall fine him a hundred shekels of silver and give them to the father of the young woman, because he has brought a bad name upon a virgin of Israel. And she shall be his wife. He may not divorce her all his days.
NIV	They shall fine him a hundred shekels of silver and give them to the girl's father, because this man has given an Israelite virgin a bad name. She shall continue to be his wife; he must not divorce her as long as he lives.
