## Meaning

\* Yahweh - God's personal name

lt is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word יְּהֹוָה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament

The Hebrew אַת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.

For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by אָלהֵים ( מַּלֵכנּוּ לְמֵען תָּחִיוּן וְטָוֹב לָבֶּٰם וְהַאָּרַבְתֵּם יָמִים בָּאֵרֶץ plugin-autotooltip bigy־־אַ

### Meaning:

\* Earth (e.g. Genesis 1:1) or world \* Land \* Countries or country

The word אַרץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground.

When coupled with heavens (שַׁמֵּיִם), the phrase indicates the entire created order.Genesis 12:1 אֵשֶׁר תִּירְשִׁוּן

ESV You shall walk in all the way that the LORD your God has commanded you, that you may live, and that it may go well with you, and that you may live long in the land that you shall possess.

NIV Walk in all the way that the LORD your God has commanded you, so that you may live and prosper and prolong your days in the land that you will possess.

NLT Stay on the path that the LORD your God has commanded you to follow. Then you will live long and prosperous lives in the land you are about to enter and occupy.

The sense of  $\pi$  $\alpha$ c depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

lt an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. καὶplugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip\_bigκαί

Feminine noun. Connected to the English words "ground", "geometry" and "geology".

lt occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1 ἦς κληρονομήσετε
