	The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 אֱלֹהִים plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigאֱלֹהִים

	Meanings: * God * god * goddess * divine ones * angels Noun, masculine אֱלֹהִים עַל פְּנֵי
ESV	“You shall have no other gods before me.
NIV	“You shall have no other gods before me.
NLT	“You must not have any other god but me.
LXX	οὐκ ἔσονται plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί

	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. σοι θεοὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigθεός

	Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God ἄλλοι πρὸ προσώπου μου
KJV	Thou shalt have none other gods before me.

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
