Hebrew	Noun, masculine אֶת hebrew The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ. Genesis 1:1 אֶת־הָאֱלֹהִים

NIV	As a dream comes when there are many cares, so the speech of a fool when there are many words.
NLT	Too much activity gives you restless dreams; too many words make you a fool.
