Genesis 1:28 Psalm 103:1 Numbers 6:24 אֶתִּי גַם plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ. Genesis 1:1
ESV	Take your flocks and your herds, as you have said, and be gone, and bless me also!"
NIV	Take your flocks and herds, as you have said, and go. And also bless me."
NLT	Take your flocks and herds, as you said, and be gone. Go, but bless me as you leave."
