	הִיְהִיָּה תוֹרַת אֲחֵת יִהְיֶה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The word הִיְהִיָּה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לֹאֲזָרָה וְלִגֵּר הָיָה בְּתוֹכְכֶם
ESV	There shall be one law for the native and for the stranger who sojourns among you.”
NIV	The same law applies to the native-born and to the alien living among you.”
NLT	This instruction applies to everyone, whether a native-born Israelite or a foreigner living among you.”

	είς is the cardinal number (“one”). Sometimes it functions as a indefinitely pronoun (“someone” or “a certain one”). It agrees in gender, number and case with the noun it modifies. 	είμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. τῷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ, ἡ, τό
