ESV	When they came to Marah, they could not drink the water of Marah because it was bitter; therefore it was named Marah.
NIV	When they came to Marah, they could not drink its water because it was bitter. (That is why the place is called Marah.)
NLT	When they came to the oasis of Marah, the water was too bitter to drink. So they called the place Marah (which means "bitter").

LXX	ἡλθον δὲ greek δὲ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. εἰς Μερρὰ καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” οὐκ ἠδύναντο πλεῖν ἐκ Μερρὰς πικρὸν γὰρ ἦν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. διὰ greek Meaning: * Through * Because * On account of Preposition that relates to movement through space, time, means or cause - it's a preposition of movement and mediation.
