Meaning

* Yahweh - God's personal name

lt is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word יְהוְּה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

The word הַיָּה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.

This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.

* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 מֶּלָהָה בָּוֹ לְעֵינֵי כְל בֵּית יִשְׂרָאֵל בָּכָּל מֶסְעֵיהֶם

ESV For the cloud of the LORD was on the tabernacle by day, and fire was in it by night, in the sight of all the house of Israel throughout all their journeys. NIV

So the cloud of the LORD was over the tabernacle by day, and fire was in the cloud by night, in the sight of all the house of Israel during all their travels.

The cloud of the LORD hovered over the Tabernacle during the day, and at night fire glowed inside the cloud so the whole family of Israel could see it. This continued NLT throughout all their journeys.
