	הָיָה יִמְרְאֵיהֶם דְּמוּת אֶחָד לְאַרְבַּעַתָּם כַּאֲשֶׁר יִהְיֶה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 הָאֹפֶן בְּתוֹךְ הָאֹפֶן
ESV	And as for their appearance, the four had the same likeness, as if a wheel were within a wheel.
NIV	As for their appearance, the four of them looked alike; each was like a wheel intersecting a wheel.
NLT	All four wheels looked alike and were made the same; each wheel had a second wheel turning crosswise within it.

IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἢplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article ὁψις αὐτῶνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ὁμοίωμα ἐν τοῖςplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article τέσσαρσιν ὁν τρόπον ὅταν ἦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. τροχὸς ἐνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. μέσω τροχοῦ
