	אֶל שֹׁדֵה טוֹב אֶל מֵיִם רַבִּים הִיא שְׂתוּלָה לַעֲשׂוֹת עֵנָף וְלִשְׂאת פְּרִי לְהַיּוֹת הִיחָה hebrew The word הִיחָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לִנְפוֹר אֲדָרֶת
ESV	It had been planted on good soil by abundant waters, that it might produce branches and bear fruit and become a noble vine.
NIV	It had been planted in good soil by abundant water so that it would produce branches, bear fruit and become a splendid vine.'
NLT	even though it was already planted in good soil and had plenty of water so it could grow into a splendid vine and produce rich leaves and luscious fruit.

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. εἷς ἄμπελον μεγάλην
