

Ezekiel 23:2

Hebrew	בְּרִאשׁוֹן אִשָּׁה וּשְׁנֵי בָנוֹת אִם אַחַת הָיָה hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2
	ESV “Son of man, there were two women, the daughters of one mother.
	NIV “Son of man, there were two women, daughters of the same mother.
	NLT “Son of man, once there were two sisters who were daughters of the same mother.
LXX	οὗτε ἀνθρώπου δύο γυναῖκες ἦσαν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. θυγατέρες μητρὸς μιᾶς gree Meaning: * One * First * One thing * Alone * Individual * One ma * Someone εἷς is the cardinal number (“one”). Sometimes it functions as a indefinitely pronoun (“someone” or “a certain one”). It agrees in gender, number and case with the noun it modifies. Occurs a little under 350 times in the New Testament.Matthew 8:19John 10:30
