	The Hebrew את word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.
	For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by אֶת הָאָרֶץ (אֶת הָאָרֶץ וּמִצְרַיִם וְכָל הָאֲרָצוֹת אֲשֶׁר עִמָּהּ בַּחֲרֹב יִהְיֶה וְיִמָּצְקוּת עָלֶיהָ לְאֶרֶץ) plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

	Meaning: * Earth (e.g. Genesis 1:1) or world * Land * Countries or country The word אֶרֶץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground. When coupled with heavens (שָׁמַיִם), the phrase indicates the entire created order. Genesis 12:1 תָּרָד
ESV	With the hoofs of his horses he will trample all your streets. He will kill your people with the sword, and your mighty pillars will fall to the ground.
NIV	The hoofs of his horses will trample all your streets; he will kill your people with the sword, and your strong pillars will fall to the ground.
NLT	His horsemen will trample through every street in the city. They will butcher your people, and your strong pillars will topple.
