The word is dual in form (ending in -ים) which normally indicates two things (like eyes and hands), however, however it functions as a plural. Deuteronomy 10:14 states that Genesis 1:20Psalm 115:3</p> <p>hebrew</p> <p>The word הָיָה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.</p> <p>This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.</p> <p>* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2</p>
ESV	On its fallen trunk dwell all the birds of the heavens, and on its branches are all the beasts of the field.
NIV	All the birds of the air settled on the fallen tree, and all the beasts of the field were among its branches.
NLT	"The birds roost on its fallen trunk, and the wild animals lie among its branches.
