The Hebrew אי word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ.Genesis 1:1 האיף plugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip\_bigy.

The word אָבֶּי can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground.
