The Hebrew איז word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article ק. Hebrew It is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word הְּוֹה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

The word אָרֵץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground.

When coupled with heavens (שָׁמֵיִם), the phrase indicates the entire created order.Genesis 12:1

ESV But when they came to the nations, wherever they came, they profaned my holy name, in that people said of them. These are the people of the LORD, and yet they had to go out of his land.
