This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לָהֶם לְמִשְׁמָר
ESV	“Be ready and keep ready, you and all your hosts that are assembled about you, and be a guard for them.
NIV	“Get ready; be prepared, you and all the hordes gathered about you, and take command of them.
NLT	“Get ready; be prepared! Keep all the armies around you mobilized, and take command of them.

	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. μοι εἰς προφυλακήν
