ESV	The governor told them that they were not to partake of the most holy food, until there should be a priest to consult Urim and Thummim.
NIV	The governor ordered them not to eat any of the most sacred food until there was a priest ministering with the Urim and Thummim.
NLT	The governor told them not to eat the priests' share of food from the sacrifices until a priest could consult the LORD about the matter by using the Urim and Thummim- the sacred lots.
