	δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. καλὸν ποιοῦντες plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigποιέω
	Meaning: * To do * To make This verb - to do or make - is used in connection with a large range of activities including creation, covenant formation, obedience, miracles, sin and worship. Verb forms Present tense Person Greek Form μὴ ἐνκακῶμεν· καιρῷ γὰρ ἰδίῳ θερίσομεν μὴ ἐκλυόμενοι.
ESV	And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up.
NIV	Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.
NLT	So let's not get tired of doing what is good. At just the right time we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't give up.
KJV	And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.

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
