Hebrew	עַל כֵּן קָרָא לַבְּאֵר בְּאֵר לַחַי רֹאִי הִנֵּה בֵּין קִדְשׁ וּבֵין בֶּרֶד
ESV	Therefore the well was called Beer-lahai-roi; it lies between Kadesh and Bered.
NIV	That is why the well was called Beer Lahai Roi; it is still there, between Kadesh and Bered.
NLT	So that well was named Beer-lahai-roi (which means “well of the Living One who sees me”). It can still be found between Kadesh and Bered.

	Meaning:
	* Who * Which * What
	The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).
	It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning ἐνώπιον εἶδον ἰδοὺ ἀνὰ μέσον Καδης καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big καί
	greek
	Meaning
	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So
KJV	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἀνὰ μέσον Βαράδ
	Wherefore the well was called Beerlahairoi; behold, it is between Kadesh and Bered.

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
