The Hebrew אַ word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.

For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by אָרָקים ( אַרָּא אַלהָים blugin-autotooltip default plugin-autotooltip bigy־אָר

The word אַרֵץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground.

When coupled with heavens (פְּשִׁים), the phrase indicates the entire created order.Genesis 12:ת שֶׁלָידָ אָת pplugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip\_bigm, אַת plugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip.

The word הָיָה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.

This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.

The sense of  $\pi \tilde{\alpha} \zeta$  depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

lt an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example είμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. αὐτοῖςplugin-autotooltip default plugin-autotooltip bigαὐτός
