Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 **τοῖς**plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

Meaning:

* The sky * Air * Heaven or heavens

278 occurrences in the New Testament.

Οὐρανός is used in Scripture to describe the sky and universe (that is, the visible expanse above the earth) as well as the transcendent realm where God is present. For example, in Matthew 6:26 Matthew 24:29 Matthew 6:9 καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί

δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. Αἰαμ **οὐχ εὐρέθη βοηθὸς ὅμοιος αὐτῷ**plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
