	For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בָּרֵא אֱלֹהֵים (בֶּן הָאָמֶה לְגְוֹי אֲשִׁימֵנוּ כִּי זַרְעֲדָּ הְוּא

NIV	I will make the son of the maidservant into a nation also, because he is your offspring."
NLT	But I will also make a nation of the descendants of Hagar's son because he is your son, too."

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example $\epsilon l\mu l$ is the word for was, e.g.
