The Hebrew **אתָּ** word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article **הַ**. Genesis 1:1 **שָׁמַיָּהוּ אֶל מַעַרְתִּי שָׁמַיָּהוּ הַמִּכְפֹּלָה עַל**

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Meaning:

* Face * Presence * Front or surface

Noun. Masculine. Although it looks plural in form (ending in **-ים**), it is almost always used as a singular in meaning - a type of plural of intensity or plural of form common in Hebrew for body parts that come in pairs or have multiple aspects. **הוּא חִבְרוֹן בְּאֶרֶץ**

אֶרֶץ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-

Meaning:

* Earth (e.g. Genesis 1:1) or world * Land * Countries or country

The word **אֶרֶץ** can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground.

When coupled with heavens (**שָׁמַיִם**), the phrase indicates the entire created order. Genesis 12:1 **כְּנָעַן**

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
