Preposition meaning “in”. ἰδρῶτι τοῦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ

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The definite article προσώπου σου φάγη τὸνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ

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The definite article ἄρτον σου ἕως τοῦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ

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The definite article γῆνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigγῆ

Meaning:

* Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5)

Feminine noun. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”.

It occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1 ἐξ ἧς ἐλήμφθης ὅτι γῆplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigγῆ

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εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. καὶplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαὶ

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” [εἰς γῆν](#)

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
