This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3 Exodus 3:12 Ruth 1:1 Isaiah 2:2 יָמֵי יִצְחָק מֵאָת שָׁנָה וּשְׁמֹנִים שָׁנָה

	NIV Isaac lived a hundred and eighty years.
	NLT Isaac lived for 180 years.
LXX	ἐγένοντο δέ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big δέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. αἱ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big ὁ, ἡ, τό greek Meaning: * The The definite article. It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning ἔζησεν ἔτη ἑκατὸν ὀγδοήκοντα
