Hebrew	ואחר יצא אחיו אשר על ידו השגי ויקרא שמו זרח
ESV	Afterward his brother came out with the scarlet thread on his hand, and his name was called Zerah.
NIV	Then his brother, who had the scarlet thread on his wrist, came out and he was given the name Zerah.
NLT	Then the baby with the scarlet string on his wrist was born, and he was named Zerah.

Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ἐφ' ᾧ ἦνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense.
