|        | <p>The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.</p> <p>This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.</p> <p>* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 אֲבִי יֵשֶׁב אֶהָל וּמִקְנֶה</p> |

| NIV    | Adah gave birth to Jabal; he was the father of those who live in tents and raise livestock.                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                   |

IT is most frequently translated as “and” <a href="#">ἔτεκεν</a> Αδα <a href="#">τὸν</a>plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ</p> <p>greek</p> <p>The definite article <a href="#">ὁ</a>βελ <a href="#">οὗτος</a>plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὗτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο</p> <p>greek</p> <p>Meaning:</p> <p>* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it</p> <p>Demonstrative pronoun.</p> <p><a href="#">οὗτος</a> usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 <a href="#">ἦν</a>plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί</p> <p>greek</p> <p><a href="#">εἰμί</a> is the first person singular verb for “to be” (<a href="#">εἶναι</a> [the infinitive form] = “to be”).</p> <p>It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example <a href="#">εἰμί</a> is the word for am and <a href="#">ἦν</a> is the word for was, e.g. <a href="#">ὁ</a>plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ</p> <p>greek</p> <p>The definite article <a href="#">πατὴρ οἰκούντων ἐν</a>plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν</p> <p>greek</p> <p>Preposition meaning “in”. <a href="#">σκηναῖς</a> κτηνοτρόφων</p> |
