	The Hebrew אֵת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.
	For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בָּבֶל הָוּא הָיָּה plugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_big.

	The word הָיָה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
	This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.
	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 אֲבָּי ישֵׁב אְהֶל וּמִקְנֵה
ESV	Adah bore Jabal; he was the father of those who dwell in tents and have livestock.
NIV	Adah gave birth to Jabal; he was the father of those who live in tents and raise livestock.
NLT	Adah gave birth to Jabal, who was the first of those who raise livestock and live in tents.

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example $\epsilon i \mu i$ is the word for am and $\tilde{\eta} \nu$ is the word for was, e.g. oplugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_bigo
