Hebrew	The word וַיְהִי means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 אחר הדברים האלה חטאו משקה מלך מצרים והאפה לאדניהם למלך מצרים
ESV	Some time after this, the cupbearer of the king of Egypt and his baker committed an offense against their lord the king of Egypt.
NIV	Some time later, the cupbearer and the baker of the king of Egypt offended their master, the king of Egypt.
NLT	Some time later, Pharaoh's chief cup-bearer and chief baker offended their royal master.

LXX	ἐγένετο δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. μετὰ τὰ greek Meaning: * The The definite article.
