

Genesis 41:6

Hebrew	וַהֲנִה שִׁבְעַ שְׂבָלִים דְּקוֹת וְשִׂדּוּפֹת קִדְּיִם צִמְחוּת אַחֲרֵיהֶן
ESV	And behold, after them sprouted seven ears, thin and blighted by the east wind.
NIV	After them, seven other heads of grain sprouted—thin and scorched by the east wind.
NLT	Then seven more heads of grain appeared, but these were shriveled and withered by the east wind.
LXX	ἄλλοι δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἐπὶ τὰ στάχυες λεπτοὶ καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἀνεμόφθοροι ἀνεφύοντο μετ' αὐτούς greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English)
KJV	And, behold, seven thin ears and blasted with the east wind sprung up after them.

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
