

Genesis 47:10

	בָּרַךְ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigוַיְבָרֶךְ Meaning * To kneel * To bless God as an act of adoration * To bless man as a benefit * Sometimes, to curse Verb, appearing approximately 330 times in the Old Testament.
Hebrew	The word בָּרַךְ marks important moments of covenant, worship, inheritance and hope. Genesis 1:28 Psalm 103:1 Numbers 6:24 וַיְבָרֶכֶב אֶת plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigאֶת־הָאֱלֹהִים hebrew The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בָּרָא אֱלֹהִים (פָּרַעַה וַיֵּצֵא מִלִּפְנֵי פָרַעַה
ESV	And Jacob blessed Pharaoh and went out from the presence of Pharaoh.
NIV	Then Jacob blessed Pharaoh and went out from his presence.
NLT	Then Jacob blessed Pharaoh again before leaving his court.
LXX	καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" εὐλογήσας Ἰακωβ τὸν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article Φαραω ἐξῆλθεν ἀπ' αὐτοῦ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive).
