Meaning

* To kneel * To bless God as an act of adoration * To bless man as a benefit * Sometimes, to curse

Verb, appearing approximately 330 times in the Old Testament.

The word בָּרַךְ marks important moments of covenant, worship, inheritance and hope. Genesis 1:28 Psalm 103:1 Numbers 6:24 וַיְבָרֶכֶת בָּרַךְ לְאִמּוֹרָה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big בָּרַךְ

Meanings:

* God * god * goddess * divine ones * angels

Noun, masculine אֶת plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big וַיִּשָּׂם אֶת וַיִּבְרָךְ אֶת וַיִּבְרָךְ אֶת וַיִּבְרָךְ אֶת

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The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.

For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by אֶת (אֶת אֱלֹהִים) אֶת אֱלֹהִים אֶת אֱלֹהִים אֶת אֱלֹהִים
